Shawn Foster v. Springfield ALF, LLC et al.

SUMMARY

The United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio granted the plaintiff’s motion to remand a personal injury action to the Court of Common Pleas of Clark County, Ohio. The court held that complete diversity was lacking because the decedent, whose citizenship governed the estate representative’s citizenship, and the defendants were all citizens of Ohio.

PROCEDURAL POSTURE	Plaintiff moved to remand a removed personal-injury action for lack of subject matter jurisdiction based on incomplete diversity. Defendants consented to remand.
STANDARD OF REVIEW	The removing party bears the burden of establishing federal subject matter jurisdiction. Removal is proper only when the federal district courts have original jurisdiction, including complete diversity of citizenship and an amount in controversy exceeding \$75,000.
PRECEDENTIAL VALUE	Unknown; district court remand order with no reporter citation.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the federal court had diversity subject matter jurisdiction over an action brought by an estate representative when the decedent and defendants were all citizens of Ohio.
2. Whether the action should be remanded to the Ohio Court of Common Pleas for lack of complete diversity.

HOLDINGS

1. Complete diversity did not exist because the estate representative is deemed to be a citizen of the same state as the decedent under 28 U.S.C. § 1332(c)(2), and the decedent was an Ohio citizen while the defendants were also Ohio citizens.
2. The motion to remand was granted, and the case was remanded to the Court of Common Pleas of Clark County, Ohio because the federal court lacked subject matter jurisdiction.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Judith A. Foster allegedly sustained injuries when an unsecured wheelchair tipped over while she was riding in a medical transport van owned and operated by Defendants. She later died for reasons unrelated to the case, while domiciled in Ohio. Shawn Foster, a Wisconsin resident, sued as executor of her estate; Springfield ALF, LLC and Angel Anthony were Ohio citizens.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Plaintiff brought the action as executor of Judith A. Foster's estate in the Court of Common Pleas of Clark County, Ohio. Defendants removed the case to the Southern District of Ohio under diversity jurisdiction. The district court granted Plaintiff's motion to remand, remanded the case to the state court, and terminated the federal case.

DISPOSITION

REMAND INSTRUCTIONS

The case is remanded to the Court of Common Pleas of Clark County, Ohio. The federal case is terminated on the district court's docket.
