SUMMARY

The United States District Court for the District of Minnesota adopted a magistrate judge's Report and Recommendation after finding no clear error and no timely objections. The court dismissed the matter without prejudice under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B) and denied the plaintiff's application to proceed in forma pauperis as moot.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the magistrate judge's Report and Recommendation should be accepted when no timely objections were filed.
2. Whether the action should be dismissed without prejudice under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B).
3. Whether the application to proceed in forma pauperis should be denied as moot after dismissal.

HOLDINGS

1. When no timely objections are filed, the Report and Recommendation is reviewed for clear error, and the court found no clear error.
2. The matter was dismissed without prejudice pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B).
3. Dominique B.'s application to proceed in forma pauperis was denied as moot.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Plaintiffs brought this action against the Social Security Administration or other filing departments and submitted an application to proceed in forma pauperis. A magistrate judge issued a Report and Recommendation, and the plaintiffs did not timely object. The district court found no clear error and dismissed the matter without prejudice pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B).

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

United States Magistrate Judge Dulce J. Foster issued a Report and Recommendation on January 6, 2026. No objections were filed within the permitted time. The district court reviewed the recommendation for clear error, found none, accepted it, dismissed the matter without prejudice under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B), and denied Dominique B.'s application to proceed in forma pauperis as moot.
