QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the appeal should be dismissed for want of prosecution because appellants failed to file an appellate brief after notice and an opportunity to obtain an extension.

HOLDINGS

1. An appellate court may dismiss an appeal for want of prosecution when the appellant fails to file a required brief after receiving notice that the brief is overdue and an opportunity to seek an extension.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The appeal was pending before the Texas Court of Appeals for the First District. The appellants, proceeding pro se, failed to file the required appellate brief and did not respond to the court's notice and opportunity to cure the default.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Appellants appealed from the County Civil Court at Law No. 2 of Harris County, Texas. After the appellate clerk notified appellants that their brief was overdue and that the appeal was subject to dismissal, the court directed them to file the brief and a motion for extension within ten days. Appellants did not respond, so the court dismissed the appeal and denied pending motions as moot.

We directed Appellants to file their brief and a motion requesting an extension to file the brief within 10 days of our notice. Appellants did not respond. See TEX. R. APP. P. 42.3(b), (c). We dismiss the appeal for want of prosecution for failure to file a brief. See TEX. R. APP. P. 38.8(a), 42.3(b), 43.2(f). We deny any pending motions as moot.
