People of Michigan v. Ronnie Lamont Spears

No. SC: 158828, Michigan Supreme Court (June 5, 2019)

SUMMARY

The Michigan Supreme Court denied defendant Ronnie Lamont Spears' application for leave to appeal in this criminal case, finding the question presented did not warrant review. The court's per curiam order declined to address the merits of the underlying Wayne County felony conviction (Case No. 16-002012-FC). No substantive legal issues were decided, as the denial was solely procedural.
