Laura Frizzo v. City of Iron River

SUMMARY

Michigan Supreme Court order granting defendants-appellees' motion to extend time to file an answer to the application for leave to appeal, and accepting the answer submitted on May 18, 2021, as timely filed. This published procedural ruling addresses appellate filing deadlines and the court's discretion to accept late submissions. No substantive issues on the merits were decided.

Plaintiff-appellant Laura Frizzo filed an application for leave to appeal to the Michigan Supreme Court from the Michigan Court of Appeals (COA No. 347361), which had affirmed or disposed of the appeal from the Iron County Circuit Court (Case No. 17-005475-CZ). Defendants-appellees moved for an extension of time to file their answer to the application. The Chief Justice granted the motion and accepted the answer as timely filed.
