1. Whether the district court's judgment in Williams's criminal post-conviction matter should be affirmed.

HOLDINGS

1. The judgment of the district court is affirmed.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The available docket text identifies this as a criminal post-conviction appeal brought by Mark Allen Williams.
