State of Louisiana v. Damone Young

SUMMARY

The Louisiana Court of Appeal, First Circuit denied Damone Young’s application for supervisory writs concerning a probation revocation matter. The court held that it could not review the challenged ruling because the application omitted the petition for revocation, the February 13, 2025 hearing transcript, and other supporting record documents, and it provided instructions for any future filing.

PROCEDURAL POSTURE	Damone Young applied for supervisory writs challenging a ruling in a probation-revocation proceeding in the Thirty-Second Judicial District Court for Terrebonne Parish. The Louisiana Court of Appeal, First Circuit denied the writ because the application lacked essential record documents.
STANDARD OF REVIEW	The court could not review the challenged ruling because the relator failed to provide the record documents necessary to evaluate the claims.
PRECEDENTIAL VALUE	Unknown; the opinion is a one-page per curiam supervisory-writ ruling and contains no express precedential designation.

PRACTICE AREAS

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the court could review a supervisory-writ application when the relator failed to include the record documents necessary to support the asserted claims.
2. Whether the writ application could be supplemented after filing or rehearing requested to provide the missing documents.

HOLDINGS

1. A relator seeking supervisory-writ relief must file and attach the documents and exhibits necessary to support the claims; when essential record materials are missing, the appellate court cannot review the challenged ruling and may deny the writ on the showing made.
2. The court will not consider supplementation of the writ application or an application for rehearing to cure the omission of required supporting materials.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The proceeding concerned a probation revocation and a February 13, 2025 probation-revocation hearing. Young sought supervisory-writ review but did not attach the petition for revocation, the hearing transcript, or other documentation from the record supporting his claims.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Young sought supervisory review of a ruling related to his probation revocation. The writ application did not include the petition for revocation, the February 13, 2025 probation-revocation hearing transcript, or other record documentation supporting his claims. The court denied the writ on the showing made and directed Young to request a free transcript from the Terrebonne Parish Clerk of Court if needed; it stated that supplementation or rehearing would not be considered, while permitting a new application by March 13, 2026.

In the event relator elects to file a new application with this court, the application shall be filed on or before March 13, 2026. Any future filing on this issue should include the entire contents of this application, the missing items noted above, and a copy of this ruling.
