SUMMARY

The Appellate Division, First Department, affirmed judgments against Isaiah Sullivan arising from three criminal matters. The court held that the sentences were not excessive and unanimously affirmed the judgments rendered by Supreme Court, New York County.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The opinion contains no substantive account of the underlying criminal conduct or trial facts. It states only that Sullivan appealed from judgments rendered by the Supreme Court, New York County, and that the appellate court reviewed the sentences and found them not excessive.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Isaiah Sullivan appealed to the Appellate Division, First Department, from judgments of the Supreme Court, New York County, rendered June 18, 2025. After argument and deliberation, the Appellate Division unanimously affirmed.
