QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the district court should adopt the magistrate judge's findings and recommendations when no objections were filed.
2. Whether the action should be dismissed for failure to prosecute and failure to comply with local rules and court orders.

HOLDINGS

1. When reviewing a magistrate judge's findings and recommendations, the district court presumes findings of fact correct and reviews conclusions of law de novo.
2. The action was properly dismissed for failure to prosecute, failure to comply with the court's local rules, and failure to comply with court orders.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The plaintiff failed to prosecute the action, comply with the court's local rules, and comply with court orders. A magistrate judge issued findings and recommendations, which were served on the parties with notice of a fourteen-day objection period. No objections were filed.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The matter was referred to a magistrate judge under 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B) and Local Rule 302. The magistrate judge filed findings and recommendations on November 19, 2025, recommending disposition of the action; the parties were served and did not object. The district court adopted the findings and recommendations and dismissed the action for failure to prosecute, failure to comply with local rules, and failure to comply with court orders.
