SUMMARY

The First Court of Appeals of Texas dismissed Ahmad Yazdchi and Mehdi Sadeghian's appeal for want of prosecution because they failed to file an appellate brief or respond to the court's notice. The court denied any pending motions as moot.

We directed appellants to file their brief and a motion requesting an extension to file the brief within 10 days of our notice. Appellants did not respond. See TEX. R. APP. P. 42.3(b), (c). We dismiss the appeal for want of prosecution for failure to file a brief. See TEX. R. APP. P. 38.8(a), 42.3(b), 43.2(f).
