QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the Monroe County Court's order denying defendant's application for resentencing under the Domestic Violence Survivors Justice Act should be affirmed.

HOLDINGS

1. The order denying defendant's application for resentencing is affirmed.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The opinion provides no substantive factual findings beyond identifying defendant's application for resentencing under the Domestic Violence Survivors Justice Act and the County Court's denial of that application.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Monroe County Court denied defendant's application for resentencing pursuant to the Domestic Violence Survivors Justice Act in an order rendered April 10, 2023. The Appellate Division, Fourth Department, unanimously affirmed that order for the reasons stated in the County Court's decision.
