SUMMARY

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the appellee should receive a thirty-day extension of time to file a reply brief in a discretionary review proceeding.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The underlying prosecution arose in the 359th Judicial District Court of Montgomery County, Texas, and concerned an alleged violation of the Election Code. The Fourteenth Court of Appeals reversed the judgment and conviction. The present document concerns only appellee's unopposed request for additional time to respond to the State's brief in discretionary review.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Fourteenth Court of Appeals reversed Jenkins's judgment and conviction in appellate cause number 14-13-00662-CR. The Texas Court of Criminal Appeals granted the State's petition for discretionary review on September 16, 2015. After the State received an extension and filed its brief, Jenkins sought a thirty-day extension, until January 1, 2016, to file his reply brief.
