2026 and filed April 13, 2026, and upon reading the April 28, 2026 correspondence in response by
the Deputy Chief Attorney for AGC, and having determined that Zwillman is eligible to resign for
nondisciplinary reasons, we grant his application and accept his resignation.</p> <p>Garry, P.J.,
Clark, Ceresia, Powers and Corcoran, JJ., concur.</p> <p>ORDERED that Blair Robin
Zwillman's application for permission to resign is granted and his nondisciplinary resignation is

accepted; and it is further

ORDERED that Blair Robin Zwillman's name is hereby stricken from the roll of attorneys and counselors-at-law of the State of New York, effective immediately, and until further order of this Court (*see generally* Rules for Atty Disciplinary Matters [22 NYCRR] § 1240.22 [b]); and it is further

ORDERED that Blair Robin Zwillman is commanded to desist and refrain from the practice of law in any form in the State of New York, either as principal or as agent, clerk or employee of another; and Zwillman is hereby forbidden to appear as an attorney or counselor-at-law before any court, judge, justice, board, commission or other public authority, or to give to another an opinion as to the law or its application, or any advice in relation thereto, or to hold himself out in any way as an attorney and counselor-at-law in this State; and it is further

ORDERED that Blair Robin Zwillman shall, within 30 days of the date of this decision, surrender to the Office of Court Administration any Attorney Secure Pass issued to him.
