SUMMARY

This document is a notice from the Hawai'i Supreme Court Board of Examiners listing applicants who passed the July 2010 Hawai'i Bar Examination. It is dated October 5, 2010, and reminds successful applicants that they may not practice law until they satisfy all other requirements and are admitted by the Hawai'i Supreme Court.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Which applicants passed the July 2010 Hawai'i bar examination?
2. Whether passage of the examination alone permits an applicant to practice law in Hawai'i before satisfying all other admission requirements and receiving admission from the Supreme Court.

HOLDINGS

1. Each applicant listed in the notice passed the July 2010 Hawai'i examination for admission to the Bar of the State of Hawai'i.
2. Passage of the examination alone does not authorize an applicant to practice law in Hawai'i; the applicant must satisfy all other requirements under RSCH Rule 1.3 and be admitted to practice by the Supreme Court.

"The applicants listed below are hereby notified that each has passed the July 2010 Hawai'i examination for admission to the Bar of the State of Hawai'i, as required by Rule 1.3(g)(1) of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i (RSCH):" (at 1)

"Each applicant is reminded that, until he or she has met all other requirements as set forth in RSCH Rule 1.3, and has been admitted to practice law by the Supreme Court of Hawai'i, that applicant may not engage in the practice of law in this jurisdiction." (at 3)

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The July 2010 Hawai'i bar examination was administered to applicants seeking admission to the State of Hawai'i bar. The Board of Examiners listed the applicants who passed the examination. The notice also stated that each applicant remained prohibited from practicing law until satisfying all other admission requirements and receiving admission from the Supreme Court.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Board of Examiners reviewed the results of the July 2010 examination for admission to the Bar of the State of Hawai'i and notified the listed applicants that they had passed. The notice further advised that passage alone did not authorize the applicants to practice law until all other requirements under RSCH Rule 1.3 were satisfied and admission was granted by the Supreme Court.
