QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the court should grant Appellant a second fourteen-day extension of time to file his appellate brief under Texas Rule of Appellate Procedure 38.6(d).

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Counsel represented that he had recently completed and filed a brief in Appellant's companion appeal, had not begun the brief in this appeal, and would be out of town the following week. Appellant had already been granted

an extension through September 14, 2015. The motion requested an additional fourteen days, until September 28, 2015.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Appellant had previously received an extension through September 14, 2015. His counsel requested an additional extension until September 28, 2015, citing completion of a brief in a companion appeal, lack of progress on this brief, and planned travel.
