FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Fodor filed a proper-person notice of appeal from the judgment of the Eighth Judicial District Court in Clark County, Nevada. The appeal was submitted on the record and briefs, and the Supreme Court of Nevada later directed the Attorney General to respond regarding whether Fodor had any remaining sentences for which he had not received a parole hearing. On December 17, 2021, the court entered an order affirming the district court's judgment.
