People v. Normand

SUMMARY

The Illinois Supreme Court reviewed Ernest J. Normand's convictions for possession of child pornography under Illinois law. The court held that the trial court did not improperly rely on an unconstitutional statutory definition of "child," and that the images themselves were sufficient evidence for a trier of fact to determine that they depicted actual children. The court affirmed the appellate court's judgment.
