QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the appellant should receive additional time to file his appellate brief based on his asserted medical conditions and resulting inability to meet the filing deadline.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

David Goad stated that he had suffered a stroke, undergone heart surgery, and experienced atrial fibrillation, atrial flutter, post-traumatic stress disorder, and symptoms of dementia. He asserted that a severe health setback beginning in July 2015 prevented him from completing his appellate brief and that several other court deadlines were also pending. He requested thirty days to notify the appellate court regarding his ability to complete the brief.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The document states that the matter was pending in the Fourth Court of Appeals of Texas under appellate cause number 04-15-00219-CV, with a companion appeal under cause number 04-15-00218-CV. David Goad requested additional time based primarily on claimed medical conditions and the resulting difficulty completing his brief. The provided text contains no ruling on the request.
