SUMMARY

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the court should grant appellants' unopposed request for a fourteen-day extension of time to file their reply brief.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The appellants' reply brief was due on August 10, 2015. New lead appellate counsel had recently assumed responsibility for the appeal after prior counsel's departure from the Texas Attorney General's Office and sought additional time to review the trial-court record and prepare the reply brief. The appellee did not oppose the requested fourteen-day extension.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The underlying matter was pending on appeal from the 353rd Judicial District Court of Travis County. Appellants stated that their reply brief was due August 10, 2015, and requested a new deadline of August 24, 2015, because lead appellate counsel had recently assumed responsibility for the appeal and had not participated in the trial proceedings or preparation of the opening brief. Appellee did not oppose the requested extension.
