FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The appeal required preparation of a reporter's record. Court reporter Gayle Patterson reported that the record was approximately 350 pages and covered four days of testimony, and requested additional time to file it.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The document is an information sheet completed by the court reporter in connection with an appeal pending in the First Court of Appeals of Texas. The reporter requested an extension from September 21, 2015, to October 21, 2015, to file an approximately 350-page reporter's record covering four days of testimony.
