In re Amendments to Rule 25, Rules of the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters

2017 OK 79 (Okla. 2017) · Decided October 9, 2017

SUMMARY

The Oklahoma Supreme Court amended Rule 25 of the Rules of the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters. The amendment revised requirements for temporary permit applications and removed provisions concerning permit expiration and revocation; it became effective immediately.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether Rule 25 of the Rules of the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters should be amended as proposed.

2. When the amended Rule 25 should take effect.

HOLDINGS

1. Rule 25 of the Rules of the State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters is amended in accordance with Exhibit A and the clean version in Exhibit B.
2. The amended Rule 25 is effective immediately.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The State Board of Examiners of Certified Shorthand Reporters administers rules governing temporary permits for certified shorthand reporters. The court amended Rule 25 to require applicants for temporary permits to submit a completed application and supporting materials, require the Board to report its recommendation to the Chief Justice, and encourage professional development for temporary permit holders.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The matter came before the Supreme Court of Oklahoma for consideration of an amendment to Rule 25 governing temporary permits for certified shorthand reporters. The court adopted the amended rule and made it effective immediately.
