SUMMARY

The United States District Court for the Eastern District of Missouri denied Anthony Lemicy’s motion to waive the initial partial filing fee. The Court ordered him to pay \$37.01 or submit a certified inmate account statement demonstrating inability to pay by March 9, 2026, warning that failure to comply would result in dismissal without prejudice.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- Whether the Court should waive Plaintiff's obligation to pay the \$37.01 initial partial filing fee.
- Whether Plaintiff could avoid payment by submitting certified evidence of a continued inability to pay.

HOLDINGS

1. Plaintiff remained obligated to pay the \$37.01 initial partial filing fee, and his motion to waive payment was denied.
2. Plaintiff could avoid immediate payment only by timely submitting a certified inmate account statement evidencing his continued inability to pay; failure to pay or submit the statement would result in dismissal without prejudice and without further notice.

KEY QUOTATIONS

“a court has the power to monitor a prisoner’s financial situation in order to ensure that the prisoner does not deplete his trust account in order to avoid paying the filing fee”

“Prisoners may not intentionally deplete their trust accounts just to avoid paying filing fees.”

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Anthony Lemicy is a prisoner pursuing a civil-rights action in federal court. The Court determined that he remained obligated to pay a \$37.01 initial partial filing fee. The Court permitted him to submit a certified inmate account statement showing that he had no assets or means to pay instead of making the payment.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Court had assessed Plaintiff an initial partial filing fee of \$37.01. Plaintiff moved to waive payment of that fee. The Court denied the motion and ordered Plaintiff either to pay the fee or submit a certified inmate account statement demonstrating his continued inability to pay.
