SUMMARY

The Armed Services Board of Contract Appeals dismissed with prejudice Gideon Contracting, LLC’s application for attorney fees and costs under the Equal Access to Justice Act. The dismissal followed settlement of the dispute.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the pending application for attorney fees and costs should be dismissed after settlement of the underlying dispute.

HOLDINGS

1. Because the dispute had been settled, the application for attorney fees and costs was dismissed with prejudice.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The matter arose from a government contract identified as Contract No. W912BV-20-D-0041 and Task Order No. W912BV-20-F-0139. Gideon Contracting, LLC sought attorney fees and costs under the Equal Access to Justice Act. The underlying dispute was settled.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The matter came before the Armed Services Board of Contract Appeals as an application for attorney fees and costs under the Equal Access to Justice Act. The underlying dispute was settled, and the Board dismissed the application with prejudice.
