HOLDINGS

- The action is dismissed without costs and without prejudice because counsel advised the court that the matter had settled; the court retains jurisdiction and permits reopening for good cause within 45 days if

the settlement is not consummated.

KEY QUOTATIONS

“IT IS ORDERED that the above-captioned action is hereby dismissed without costs and without prejudice to the right, upon good cause shown within 45 days, to re-open the action if settlement is not consummated. The court retains full jurisdiction over this action and this Order shall not prejudice any party to this action.” (at 17-25)

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The parties reached a settlement, as represented to the court by counsel. The court entered an order dismissing the action without costs and without prejudice, subject to reopening for good cause if the settlement was not consummated.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Counsel informed the district court that the action had settled. The court dismissed the action without costs and without prejudice, while allowing the parties 45 days to seek reopening if the settlement was not consummated.
