QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether appellants should receive an additional thirty-day extension of the deadline to file their appellate brief.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Appellants' brief was originally due April 13, 2015, and prior extensions moved the deadline to May 13 and then June 12, 2015. Appellants' lead counsel stated that preparation for a San Antonio Planning Commission matter and a Harris County District Court trial prevented counsel from giving significant attention to the appellate brief. Appellants requested an additional thirty-day extension and represented that appellees did not oppose the request.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The appeal was pending in the Fourteenth Court of Appeals from the 127th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas, trial court cause number 2010-56653-B. Appellants' brief had previously been extended twice, and appellants sought another extension, stating that counsel had competing court and administrative obligations. Appellees were represented as unopposed to the requested extension.
