SUMMARY

The Fifth Circuit reversed a decision from the Eastern District of Louisiana in a case involving the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation (FSLIC). The opinion provides no further substantive discussion, but the reversal indicates the appellate court disagreed with the lower court's ruling on an issue related to FSLIC's operations or enforcement. This case is relevant for research on FSLIC litigation and Fifth Circuit appellate procedure.
