DECISION & JUDGMENT Writ of habeas corpus in the nature of an application to release Jessica Beauvais upon her own recognizance or, in the alternative, to set reasonable bail upon Queens County Indictment No. 504/2021. ADJUDGED that the writ is dismissed, without costs or disbursements.
