SUMMARY

A United States Magistrate Judge recommends dismissing Michael Alan Dean Hill’s action without prejudice because he did not file an amended complaint by the court-ordered deadline. The recommendation cites Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(b) and Eastern District of California Local Rule 110 and advises that objections may be filed within fourteen days.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- Whether the action should be dismissed without prejudice under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(b) and Local Rule 110 because plaintiff failed to file an amended complaint after being granted leave to

amend.

HOLDINGS

1. The magistrate judge recommended that the action be dismissed without prejudice because plaintiff failed to file an amended complaint by the court-ordered deadline.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The court had dismissed plaintiff's complaint with leave to amend and set October 30, 2025, as the deadline for filing an amended complaint. Plaintiff did not file an amended complaint by that deadline.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Plaintiff's complaint was dismissed with leave to amend on May 14, 2025. After plaintiff failed to file the required amended complaint by October 30, 2025, the magistrate judge recommended dismissal without prejudice, subject to objections and review by the assigned district judge.
