Attorney Grievance Comm'n v. Antonacci

SUMMARY

The Supreme Court of Maryland ordered that Louis Bernardo Antonacci be suspended from practicing law in Maryland for one year and two days for violations of Virginia Rules of Professional Conduct 1.9(c)(1), 1.9(c)(2), and 3.1. The suspension was made effective nunc pro tunc to a temporary suspension imposed on May 27, 2026, and reinstatement requires proof of fitness to practice law.

v. * AG No. 2 LOUIS BERNARDO ANTONACCI * September Term, 2026 ORDER Upon consideration of the petition for disciplinary or remedial action and request for immediate suspension filed by the petition pursuant to Rules 19-721(a)(2) and 19-737 and upon consideration of parties' response to the Court's order to show cause, it is this 18th day of June 2026, by the Supreme Court of Maryland, ORDERED that Respondent, Louis Bernardo Antonacci, is suspended for one year and two days from the practice of law in the State of Maryland for violations of Virginia Rules of Professional Conduct 1.9(c)(1), 1.9(c)(2), and 3.1; and it is further ORDERED that before the suspension may be lifted at the conclusion of the suspension period, Mr. Antonacci must demonstrate his fitness to resume the practice of law to the satisfaction of this Court; and it is further ORDERED that the suspension is effective nunc pro tunc to the temporary suspension that was imposed by the Court on May 27, 2026; and it is further ORDERED that the Clerk of this Court shall send notice of this Order in accordance with Maryland Rule 19-761.
