Rafael Pizana III v. Glenn Hegar, Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas; and Ken Paxton, Attorney General of the State of Texas

SUMMARY

The Texas Fifteenth Court of Appeals dismissed Rafael Pizana III's appeal from an order granting the appellees' plea to the jurisdiction. The court dismissed the appeal under Texas Rule of Appellate Procedure 42.3(c) because the appellant failed to pay the appellate filing fee by the extended deadline.

The notice of appeal was filed on January 5, 2026. On January 30, 2026, we notified Appellant that this appeal is subject to dismissal unless the appellate filing fee was paid on or before February 3, 2026. See TEX. R. APP. P. 5, 12.1(b), 44.3; TEX. GOV'T CODE ANN. § 51.207.

On February 18, 2026, Appellant requested an extension of time to pay the filing fee, which we granted, giving Appellant until March 10, 2026, to pay the filing fee. We again notified Appellant that the appeal was subject to dismissal without further notice for failure to comply.

To date, Appellant has not paid the appellate filing fee. Accordingly, we dismiss the appeal. See TEX. R. APP. P. 42.3(c), 43.2(f). PER CURIAM Panel consists of Chief Justice Brister and Justices Field and Farris. 2
