SUMMARY

The Armed Services Board of Contract Appeals sustained Tudor Cliage, LLC’s appeal after the parties resolved their dispute and stipulated to judgment in favor of the appellant. The Board entered a consent judgment awarding \$9,518.85, inclusive of Contract Disputes Act interest, with no further interest payable.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- Whether, pursuant to the parties' stipulation and agreement, the Board should sustain the appeal and enter a monetary judgment in favor of Tudor Cliage, LLC.

HOLDINGS

1. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. §§ 7105(e) and 7108(b) and the parties' stipulation and agreement, the appeal is sustained and a monetary award of \$9,518.85 is entered in favor of Tudor Cliage, LLC.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The appeal arose under Contract No. W91248-22-A-0003. The parties resolved their dispute and agreed that judgment should be entered in favor of Tudor Cliage, LLC. The Board awarded Tudor Cliage \$9,518.85, inclusive of Contract Disputes Act interest, and stated that no further interest would be paid.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Tudor Cliage, LLC appealed to the Armed Services Board of Contract Appeals under Contract No. W91248-22-A-0003. The parties resolved the dispute and submitted a stipulation and agreement requesting judgment for the appellant. The Board sustained the appeal and entered a consent judgment awarding \$9,518.85, inclusive of Contract Disputes Act interest.
