The Supreme Court, Bronx County, rendered judgment on July 27, 2021. Kenny Johnson appealed, and the Appellate Division, First Department, affirmed after considering the appeal and concluding that the sentence was not excessive.

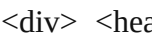

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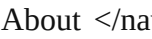
