QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- Whether the time for filing Appellant's brief should be extended under Texas Rule of Appellate Procedure 38.6(d).

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Appellant's brief was due October 23, 2015. Appellant's lead appellate counsel, a sole practitioner who was not trial counsel, asserted that she had other appellate and bankruptcy matters, an impending trial, ongoing discovery, and scheduled mediations that required additional time. The motion sought an extension through November 25, 2015.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The provided document is Appellant Chi Truc Hoang's motion requesting a thirty-three-day extension of the deadline for filing the appellant's brief. The motion states that the brief was due October 23, 2015, and requests an extension until November 25, 2015, based primarily on counsel's conflicting appellate, bankruptcy, discovery, mediation, and trial obligations.
