Taylor v. Morgan

714 F. Supp. 888 · Decided February 24, 1989

SUMMARY

The court summarily dismissed William Eugene Taylor's federal habeas corpus petition challenging the admission of evidence obtained through an allegedly unconstitutional search and seizure. Applying *Stone v. Powell*, the court held that federal habeas review was barred because Tennessee provided, and Taylor received, a full and fair opportunity to litigate his Fourth Amendment claim.
