SUMMARY

The New York Appellate Division, Third Department granted Elizabeth Ann Wilson’s application to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons. The court accepted her resignation, struck her name from the roll of attorneys, prohibited her from practicing law in New York, and ordered her to surrender her Attorney Secure Pass.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether Elizabeth Ann Wilson was eligible to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons.
2. What orders should follow from accepting her nondisciplinary resignation.

HOLDINGS

1. Wilson was eligible to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons, and her application for permission to resign was properly granted.
2. Upon accepting Wilson's nondisciplinary resignation, the court ordered that her name be stricken from the roll of New York attorneys, that she desist from practicing law or holding herself out as an attorney in New York, and that she surrender any Attorney Secure Pass within 30 days.

“Upon reading Wilson's affidavit sworn to May 7, 2026 and filed May 18, 2026, upon reading the supplemental affidavit sworn to May 18, 2026, and filed May 19, 2026, and upon reading the June 17, 2026 correspondence in response by the Deputy Chief Attorney for AGC, and having determined that Wilson is eligible to resign for nondisciplinary reasons, we grant her application and accept her resignation.” ([*1])

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Elizabeth Ann Wilson was admitted to practice by the Appellate Division, Third Department, in 2020 and listed a business address in Washington, DC. She sought permission to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons. She submitted affidavits, and the Attorney Grievance Committee for the Third Judicial Department did not oppose the application.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Elizabeth Ann Wilson was admitted to practice by the Third Department in 2020 and filed an affidavit and supplemental affidavit supporting her application to resign for nondisciplinary reasons. After reviewing the affidavits and the Attorney Grievance Committee's response, the court determined that Wilson was eligible and granted the application, accepted her resignation, and ordered her name stricken from the roll of attorneys.

DISPOSITION

approved
