Matter of Wheatley

SUMMARY

The Appellate Division, Third Department granted Nathan Allan Wheatley's application to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons. The court accepted his resignation, struck his name from the roll of attorneys effective immediately, prohibited him from practicing law in New York, and ordered him to surrender any Attorney Secure Pass within 30 days.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether Nathan Allan Wheatley was eligible to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons under 22 NYCRR 1240.22(a).
2. Whether the court should grant the application, accept the resignation, strike Wheatley's name from the roll of attorneys, and impose the associated restrictions under 22 NYCRR 1240.22(b).

HOLDINGS

1. Wheatley was eligible to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons under 22 NYCRR 1240.22(a), and his application for permission to resign was granted.
2. Upon accepting Wheatley's resignation, the court ordered that his name be stricken from the roll of New York attorneys, that he desist from practicing law or holding himself out as an attorney in New York, and that he surrender any Attorney Secure Pass within 30 days.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Nathan Allan Wheatley was admitted to practice law by the Third Department in 2012 and maintained a business address in Ohio. He sought permission to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons. The Attorney Grievance Committee advised that it did not oppose the application, and the court determined that Wheatley was eligible for nondisciplinary resignation.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Wheatley submitted an affidavit seeking nondisciplinary resignation, which was filed on January 27, 2026. After reviewing the application and the Attorney Grievance Committee's response, the Appellate Division determined that Wheatley was eligible to resign and granted the application, accepted his resignation, and ordered that his name be stricken from the roll of attorneys.

Per Curiam. Nathan Allan Wheatley was admitted to practice by this Court in 2012 and lists a business address in Columbus, Ohio with the Office of Court Administration. Wheatley now seeks leave to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons (see Rules for Atty Disciplinary Matters [22 NYCRR] § 1240.22 [a]).

The Attorney Grievance Committee for the Third Judicial Department (hereinafter AGC) advises that it does not oppose Wheatley's application. Upon reading Wheatley's affidavit sworn to January 21, 2026, and filed January 27, 2026, and upon reading the February 25, 2026 correspondence in response by the Deputy Chief Attorney for AGC, and having determined that Wheatley is eligible to resign for nondisciplinary reasons, we grant his application and accept his resignation.

Clark, J.P., Aarons, Ceresia, McShan and Corcoran, JJ., concur. ORDERED that Nathan Allan Wheatley's application for permission to resign is granted and his nondisciplinary resignation is accepted; and it is further ORDERED that Nathan Allan Wheatley's name is hereby stricken from the roll of attorneys and counselors-at-law of the State of New York, effective immediately, and until further order of this Court (see generally Rules for Atty Disciplinary Matters [22 NYCRR] § 1240.22 [b]); and it is further ORDERED that Nathan Allan Wheatley is commanded to desist and refrain from the practice of law in any form in the State of New York, either as principal or as agent, clerk or employee of another; and Wheatley is hereby forbidden to appear as an attorney or counselor-at-law before any court, judge, justice, board, commission or other public authority, or to give to another an opinion as to the law or its application, or any advice in relation thereto, or to hold himself out in any way as an attorney and counselor-at-law in this State; and it is further ORDERED that Nathan Allan Wheatley shall, within 30 days of the date of this decision, surrender to the Office of Court Administration any Attorney Secure Pass issued to him.
