QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the appeal should be dismissed because the appellants failed to file their brief and enumeration of errors within the time allowed by the Court.

HOLDINGS

1. The appeal was dismissed because the appellants failed to file their brief and enumeration of errors by the extended deadline.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The appellants' appeal was docketed in the Court of Appeals on December 30, 2014. Although the Court granted an extension through February 12, 2015, the appellants had not filed their brief and enumeration of errors as of March 3, 2015.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The appeal was docketed on December 30, 2014. The Court extended the appellants' deadline to file their brief and enumeration of errors through February 12, 2015, but they failed to file them. The appellee moved to dismiss on February 18, 2015, and the Court granted the motion.
