Gloria Vazquez v. Jonatan Garcia

SUMMARY

The First Court of Appeals of Texas dismissed Gloria Vazquez's appeal for want of prosecution because she failed to file an appellate brief after being notified that the brief was overdue. The court also dismissed any pending motions as moot.

P. 38.6(a), 38.8(a). On August 28, 2025, the Clerk of this Court notified appellant that her appellate brief was past due, and her appeal was subject to dismissal. See TEX. R. APP. P. 38.8(a), 42.3(b), 43.2(f). We directed appellant to file her brief and a motion requesting an extension to file the brief within 10 days of our notice. Appellant did not respond.
