Khalil Abdul-Aziz v. Enfin Corp., Hatch Bank, and Does 1–10

SUMMARY

The United States District Court for the Southern District of California granted Defendants’ motion to compel arbitration and stayed the proceedings. The court held that the parties clearly and unmistakably delegated the threshold question of arbitrability to the arbitrator and therefore declined to reach the parties’ remaining arguments.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- Whether the parties clearly and unmistakably delegated the threshold question of arbitrability to the arbitrator.
- Whether the action should be stayed pending completion of arbitration.

HOLDINGS

1. The parties clearly and unmistakably delegated the threshold question of arbitrability to the arbitrator.
2. The court must stay the case while arbitration is pending.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The plaintiff sued Enfin Corp., Hatch Bank, and Does 1–10 in a putative class action. The defendants sought to compel arbitration and stay the litigation. The court resolved the motion based on its finding that the parties clearly and unmistakably delegated the threshold question of arbitrability to the arbitrator.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The plaintiff brought the action against Enfin Corp., Hatch Bank, and Does 1–10. The defendants moved to compel arbitration and stay the proceedings. After oral argument on October 23, 2025, the district court granted the motion and stayed the case pending arbitration.
