SUMMARY

The First Court of Appeals of Texas granted Anthony P. Griffin, Inc.’s motion to dismiss its appeal after the trial court vacated the challenged judgment, rendering the appeal moot. The court dismissed the appeal and all other pending motions as moot.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the appeal should be voluntarily dismissed after the trial court vacated the complained-of judgment.
2. Whether the court should dismiss the remaining pending motions as moot.

HOLDINGS

1. The court granted appellant's motion and dismissed the appeal because the complained-of judgment had been vacated and no party opposed voluntary dismissal.
2. All other pending motions were dismissed as moot.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The trial court entered a final judgment on January 3, 2022. The trial court later vacated that judgment, causing appellant to represent that the appeal had become moot and to request voluntary dismissal.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Anthony P. Griffin, Inc. appealed the 56th District Court of Galveston County's January 3, 2022 final judgment. While the appeal was pending, the trial court vacated that judgment, and appellant moved to dismiss the appeal; no other party filed a notice of appeal, and appellees did not oppose voluntary dismissal.
