Because the Court disposed of cause number 05- 15-01169-CV before receiving relator's supplement, we treat the supplement as a new petition for writ of mandamus. Relator's complaints concern the sequence of the trial court's handling of various motions in the case. Ordinarily, to obtain mandamus relief, a relator must show both that the trial court has clearly abused its discretion and that relator has no adequate appellate remedy.

In re Prudential Ins. Co., 148 S.W.3d 124, 135–36 (Tex. 2004) (orig. proceeding). After reviewing the record, we conclude that relator has failed to demonstrate the trial court has abused its discretion. We deny the petition. /David L. Bridges/ 151280F.P05 DAVID L. BRIDGES JUSTICE
