HOLDINGS

1. For good cause, the court recommended granting the Commissioner's unopposed motion to reverse and remand the case for further administrative proceedings.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The opinion contains no substantive factual discussion concerning Simpson's underlying Social Security claim. It states only that the Commissioner requested voluntary remand for further administrative proceedings and that the motion was unopposed.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Jason Simpson brought an action seeking judicial review of a Social Security Administration decision. The Commissioner filed an unopposed motion for voluntary remand, and the court recommended reversal and remand for further administrative proceedings under sentence four of 42 U.S.C. § 405(g). The recommendation was transmitted to District Judge James M. Moody, Jr., subject to fourteen-day objections.

DISPOSITION

reversed_and_remanded

REMAND INSTRUCTIONS

The case is to be reversed and remanded to the Commissioner for further administrative proceedings. The remand is identified as a sentence-four remand under 42 U.S.C. § 405(g), subject to adoption of the recommendation by the district judge.
