United States v. Tedric Davis

SUMMARY

In an unpublished per curiam opinion, the Fifth Circuit granted counsel's motion to withdraw under **Anders v. California** and dismissed Tedric Davis's direct criminal appeal as frivolous, finding no nonfrivolous issues for review. The court concurred with counsel's assessment after reviewing the brief and relevant portions of the record. The opinion is not precedent except under limited circumstances under 5th Cir. R. 47.5.4.
