SUMMARY

This document is a motion filed by Marco Polo Medina-Gonzalez in the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals requesting a 90-day extension of time to file a petition for discretionary review. The motion states that the underlying conviction was affirmed on November 20, 2014, and cites counsel's workload, scheduled proceedings, holidays, and the appellant's incarceration as grounds for the requested extension.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether appellant should receive a ninety-day extension of time to file a petition for discretionary review.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The underlying conviction was affirmed by a Texas court of appeals on November 20, 2014. Appellant was incarcerated. His attorney represented that competing appellate and trial obligations, continuing legal education commitments, judicial duties, and the holiday period prevented timely completion of the petition for discretionary review.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The court of appeals affirmed appellant's conviction on November 20, 2014, in cause number 10-13-00394-CR. Appellant stated that his petition for discretionary review was due December 20, 2014, and requested an extension until March 21, 2015 based on counsel's workload, scheduled trials, professional obligations, and appellant's incarceration. The document text contains the motion and certificate of service but does not include an order granting or denying the requested extension.
