Matter of Gohn

SUMMARY

The Appellate Division, Third Department, granted Sandra P. Gohn's application to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons. The court accepted her resignation, struck her name from the roll of attorneys, prohibited her from practicing law in New York, and ordered her to surrender any Attorney Secure Pass.

Sandra P. Gohn was admitted to practice by this Court in 2008 and lists a business address in Baltimore, Maryland with the Office of Court Administration. Gohn now seeks leave to resign from the New York bar for nondisciplinary reasons (see Rules for Atty Disciplinary Matters [22 NYCRR] § 1240.22 [a]).

The Attorney Grievance Committee for the Third Judicial Department (hereinafter AGC) advises that it does not oppose Gohn's application. Upon reading Gohn's affidavit sworn to January 16, 2026 and filed January 27, 2026, and upon reading the February 24, 2026 correspondence in response by the Deputy Chief Attorney for AGC, and having determined that Gohn is eligible to resign for nondisciplinary reasons, we grant her application and accept her resignation.

Clark, J.P., Ceresia, Fisher, Powers and Corcoran, JJ., concur. ORDERED that Sandra P. Gohn's application for permission to resign is granted and her nondisciplinary resignation is accepted; and it is further ORDERED that Sandra P. Gohn's name is hereby stricken from the roll of attorneys

and counselors-at-law of the State of New York, effective immediately, and until further order of this Court (see generally Rules for Atty Disciplinary Matters [22 NYCRR] § 1240.22 [b]); and it is further ORDERED that Sandra P. Gohn is commanded to desist and refrain from the practice of law in any form in the State of New York, either as principal or as agent, clerk or employee of another; and Gohn is hereby forbidden to appear as an attorney or counselor-at-law before any court, judge, justice, board, commission or other public authority, or to give to another an opinion as to the law or its application, or any advice in relation thereto, or to hold herself out in any way as an attorney and counselor-at-law in this State; and it is further ORDERED that Sandra P. Gohn shall, within 30 days of the date of this decision, surrender to the Office of Court Administration any Attorney Secure Pass issued to her.
