QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the appellee should receive an eight-day extension of time to file her appellate brief.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The appellee's brief was due on April 15, 2015. Counsel identified numerous competing obligations during the preceding thirty days, including responses to dispositive motions, summary-judgment proceedings, mediation,

another appellate brief deadline, and scheduled presentations. Appellee sought an eight-day extension and represented that the request was unopposed and not made for purposes of delay.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The appellee's brief was due April 15, 2015. Appellee requested an eight-day extension to April 23, 2015, citing counsel's competing litigation deadlines, hearings, mediation, and continuing legal education presentations. The motion states that appellee had previously received one thirty-day extension and that appellant's counsel was unopposed.
