In re Bower

SUMMARY

The Supreme Court of Ohio imposed an interim suspension from the practice of law on George Kevin Bower after receiving a certified judgment entry of his felony conviction. The court referred the matter for disciplinary investigation and prescribed requirements concerning cessation of practice, client notifications, continuing legal education, reinstatement, and reimbursement to the Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the filing of a certified entry of Bower's felony conviction warranted an interim suspension from the practice of law under Gov.Bar R. V(18).
2. What ancillary restrictions and compliance obligations should accompany the interim suspension.

HOLDINGS

1. Upon the filing of a certified judgment entry of respondent's felony conviction, the Supreme Court of Ohio ordered respondent suspended from the practice of law for an interim period effective immediately.
2. The interim suspension immediately barred respondent from practicing law or performing legal services, required referral for disciplinary investigation and proceedings, and imposed specified notice, client-property, continuing-education, reimbursement, recordkeeping, and reinstatement requirements.

KEY QUOTATIONS

“respondent, George Kevin Bower, Attorney Registration No. 0009631, last known business address in Rittman, Ohio, is suspended from the practice of law for an interim period, effective as of the date of this entry.” (¶ 2)

“It is further ordered that this matter is referred to disciplinary counsel for investigation and the commencement of disciplinary proceedings.” (¶ 3)

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

George Kevin Bower was an attorney licensed to practice law in Ohio. The director of the Board of Professional Conduct filed with the Supreme Court a certified judgment entry showing that Bower had been convicted of a felony.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On March 4, 2021, the director of the Board of Professional Conduct filed the certified felony-conviction entry pursuant to Gov.Bar R. V(18). The Supreme Court of Ohio imposed an interim suspension, referred the matter to disciplinary counsel for investigation and disciplinary proceedings, and imposed related practice, notice, continuing-education, reimbursement, and reinstatement conditions.
