SUMMARY

The New York Appellate Division, Second Department denied Michael Webb’s application for a writ of error coram nobis. The court held that Webb failed to establish that he was denied effective assistance of appellate counsel.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the appellant established that he was denied the effective assistance of appellate counsel so as to warrant coram nobis relief vacating the prior appellate decision.

HOLDINGS

1. The appellant failed to establish that he was denied the effective assistance of appellate counsel; therefore, his application for a writ of error coram nobis was denied.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The appellant was convicted in a judgment rendered by the County Court, Westchester County, on April 4, 1990. The Appellate Division affirmed that judgment in a decision and order dated November 4, 1991. Webb later alleged that appellate counsel had been ineffective and sought coram nobis relief vacating the prior appellate decision.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The County Court, Westchester County, rendered a judgment on April 4, 1990. The Appellate Division affirmed that judgment in *People v. Webb*, 177 AD2d 524, on November 4, 1991. Webb then applied for a writ of error coram nobis to vacate the prior appellate decision, and the Appellate Division denied the application.
