QUESTIONS PRESENTED

1. Whether the district court should accept the magistrate judge's Report and Recommendation when no party objected and the recommendation contained no clear error.
2. Whether the plaintiff's request for relief should be denied and the defendant's request for relief granted.

HOLDINGS

1. When no party objects to a magistrate judge's Report and Recommendation, the district court reviews it for clear error; finding no clear error, the court accepted the Report and Recommendation.
2. The plaintiff's request for relief was denied, and the defendant's request for relief was granted.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The opinion concerns a Social Security Administration matter in which Cynthia E. sought relief and Frank Bisignano, in his official capacity as Commissioner of Social Security Administration, sought relief. The district court's order does not describe the underlying benefits dispute or factual record.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

United States Magistrate Judge Leo I. Brisbois issued a Report and Recommendation on January 14, 2026. No party objected. The district court reviewed the recommendation for clear error, accepted it, denied the plaintiff's request for relief, granted the defendant's request for relief, and directed entry of judgment.
