Estate of Robert Muhammad v. William Gresley

No. SC: 159566, 159567, Michigan Supreme Court (May 24, 2019)

SUMMARY

Michigan Supreme Court granted defendants' motion for an extension of time to file their answer to the plaintiff's application for leave to appeal in this estate litigation. The order set a new deadline of July 3, 2019, for the answer. No substantive legal issues were addressed; the ruling is purely procedural.
